	is accessible, the water distribution system must be connected to it unless otherwise permitted by the
	administrative authority."

	MN Statute 4725.3750. No new private wells shall be constructed where municipal water system is
	available. Any question to the systems availability must be confirmed by Stockton City Council for
	review or need for expansion of the system. Any new construction must meet the Stockton
	Subdivision Ordinance."
Hydrants:	Request pressure testing when system is online.
Water Hook ups:	Question was asked whether a homeowner could hook into the City line, with a meter, but not open
	the curb stop, to have the amount assessed to their property now. They would not be using the water,
	and since the grant specifies any hook ups must use the water this would not be permittable.
Rates:	Chris brought new spreadsheets with water and sewer rates. Committee discussed rates and recommend
	for water: \$10.00 base fee with \$3.00 per 1,000 gallons per month and for sewer: base fee of
	\$5.00 with \$3.50 per 1,000 gallons per month. Current flat rate of sewer is \$25 per month, with the water
	pricing the maximum amount would be \$22.50 per month (residential only). Conservation rate for water
	would still be \$5.25 per 1,000 gallon after 9,000 gallons used.
