OLD BUSINESS

- E. 9th St. Sewer Ext.: Tim Stockman was in attendance to present Pay Number #3 for Elcor Construction in the amount of \$19,151.24. Dave Johannes made a motion to approve payment to Elcor, motion seconded by Mark Potter. Motion passed unanimously. Mr. Stockman did meet with Elcor to discuss the cul-de-sac blacktop problem. Elcor will come back and hot roll the blacktop as heavy trucks are leaving tire marks due to the blacktop being soft by the recent heat.
- **Splash Pad:** Clerk Winchester is looking into a grant to help fund the pad. She will also look at insurance costs of the pad. Discussion was held on checking with other residents to see what they would like to see around town or at the park.
- Solar Panels: Discussion was held on estimated life span, warranty of panels, and estimated utility bills being raised. Winona Renewable Energy was in attendance to discuss with the council.
