On Tuesday, March 25, 2014, at the Stockton City Hall, Mayor Chris Parker called to order the Stockton City Council meeting at 7:03 P.M. Council members in attendance were Lisa Gibbs, Jack Roberts, Neil Hielmeland, and Chad Wangen.

The Pledge of Allegiance was said.

Public Voice forum: none

Clerk Winchester will change the resolution to 11-March-2014 under Hwy Beautification and take off the four names and leave as candidates for interviews. Neil Hjelmeland made a motion to accept the March 11, 2014 minutes with corrections. Motion seconded by Lisa Gibbs, motion passed unanimously.

OLD BUSINESS

Community Center entrance: Back on July 17, 2012 a quote was given for 2-4'x4' windows and full wall at a cost of \$10,808 and half a wall would cost \$6,957, from Hodgdon Construction. Council would like to get another quote from Hodgdon first.

Basketball hoops: Discussion was held on where a new court would go, between the mailboxes and the big parking lot. Clerk will get quote for a basketball court made out of blacktop.

Discussion was held on Mayo parking, City should have painted lines on the side lot by the zoning ordinance. Lisa Gibbs stated the lot should be permitted since the overflow had five extra cars in the big lot, and if the hall is rented then that cuts down on hall parking. The small lot should be for Stockton residents that need it only. Clerk will look into permitting for the lot on whether the City needs an ordinance or can just permit passes for the space in the small lot. Gravelling the small lot to extend parking was discussed, and Chad Larson will look into that.

NEW BUSINESS

Sewer Services, 9th Street: Discussion was held on extending sewer services for those that don't have sewer on East Ninth Street. A main line would run along Outlot A, with another main for the south side residence. The septic systems along the street are 20 years or older, and if not maintained correctly they will start to fail. Clerk will call Bill Trygstad for a sewer plan, and will check to see if the residents want the sewer.

CITY MAINTENANCE

Part-Time Worker: Discussion was held on the four candidates that were interviewed. One was dropped from the list since he called and stated he could not take the job if it was 30+ hours, he could only take 20-25 hours. Jack Roberts made a motion to hire Mike Lafky at \$12.50 per hour, with a second from Neil Hjelmeland. Motion passed unanimously.

Neil Hjelmeland made a motion to close the Stockton City Council meeting, with a second from Lisa Gibbs. Motion passed unanimously, meeting adjourned at 7:53 P.M.
