

On Tuesday, November 18, 2014, Mayor Chris Parker called to order the Stockton City Council meeting at 7:00 PM. Council members in attendance were Jack Roberts, Lisa Gibbs, Neil Hjelmeland and Chad Wangen.

The Pledge of Allegiance was said.

Public Voice Forum: Adam Johnson asked about the Verizon Cell phone tower, the location owners backed out of the deal. Joan Roberts asked how the City could assess her property for their renters not getting dog tags. The Dog Ordinance does not state the property owner's would be assessed if the tags were not paid. Clerk Winchester will look into the Ordinance and the MN Statutes on assessing owners.

Agenda: Natural Gas can be deleted from the agenda. Lisa Gibbs made a motion to accept the agenda with deletion, motion seconded by Jack Roberts. Motion passed as one.

Bills to be paid were sent to the Council members via email, Lisa Gibbs and Jack Roberts approved of the bills to be paid prior to this Council meeting. Jack Roberts made a motion to accept the financial report, with a second from Neil Hjelmeland. Motion passed

Neil Hjelmeland made a motion to accept the October 2014 minutes with a second from Lisa Gibbs. Motion passed all together.

OLD BUSINESS

Speed signs MHP: There were 5 people that either called or were in attendance that were opposed to the change of 20 MHP. There are two 10 MPH signs out now, one on Hickory Lane and one on Jenny Lane. If the speed limit goes up to 20 MPH, then the cars will go 30 instead.

NEW BUSINESS

Election Results: Recount to be November 20th at 9 AM at the Winona County Government Center for the Mayor Race. Stockton was picked to also recount the state races as well.

Promotional Group: Pattie Olsen would like to have the Promotional group move to the old Senior Citizen's room as a place to store all the group things. Discussion was held on having Hillsdale Township move their stuff into the room and they share the room. Chris Parker made a motion to have the previous Senior room to be shared by the Promotional Group and Hillsdale Township, to be used as a storage & meeting room. Motion seconded by Neil Hjelmeland. Motion passed universally.

Access Channel: HBC gave a quote for a new computer, scan converter, install and train for \$1,000. Looking at new laptops for Assistant Riemann would cost less than the \$600 they quoted for a new computer. Chris Parker made a motion to upgrade to a new laptop required to update the access channel, but that the City does not exceed \$1000 regardless of replacement or upgrade of one computer. Lisa Gibbs seconded the motion, motion passed totally.

Snow Plow Contract: Potter Construction sent a quote for snow plowing at \$115 per hour. Jack Roberts made a motion to accept the quote, with a second from Lisa Gibbs. Motion passed unanimously.

BUILDING PERMITS

Winona Homes: 8400 Cherry Lane: Winona Homes wanted to begin the basement section, copies of the plan went out by email with Jack Roberts checking the site plan, Greg Olson checking the building plan, and everything has been received by the Clerk. Jack Roberts made a motion to accept the building permit for 8400 Cherry Lane, with a second by Chad Wangen. Motion passed as one.

House Fill: Stacy Hermann was in attendance to discuss placing fill on the property on County Road 23 South, to place a 50' x 30' house on the property. The fill will be placed this year, with the house being built next spring. There will be about 4-feet of fill, making it 222 cubic yards of fill and the 15-foot of tapered fill will not hit 1,000 cubic yards. Neil Hjelmeland made a motion to not exceed 1,000 cubic yards of fill, and they need to fill out the fill permit. Chad Wangen seconded the motion, motion passed unopposed.

Chad Wangen made a motion to close the Stockton City Council meeting, with a second from Lisa Gibbs. Motion passed unanimously, meeting adjourned at 7:42 PM.
