All paperwork has been received. The tower and utility building will be out of the flood plain area. Lisa Gibbs made a motion for a public hearing on December 10, 2013 at 6:45 P.M. Motion seconded by Neil Hjelmeland, motion passed unanimously

## **NEW BUSINESS**

**Natural Gas:** Rory Lenton from MN Energy Resources met with Mayor Parker and Jack Roberts. They will put together an engineering assessment evaluation, and come back to the City in about 2-3 months with a cost analysis. They would lay the lines through town and 75' from the property lines to the residence homes. The City would need to come up with the final cost, which could be bonded and assessed to the property owners like the blacktop.
