

On Tuesday, October 13, 2020, Mayor Dave Johannes called to order the Stockton City Council meeting at 6:05 PM. Council members in attendance were Lisa Gibbs and Mark Potter, Neil Hjelmeland participated from Zoom. Council member Travis McElmury was not in attendance.

The Pledge of Allegiance was said.

Public Voice Forum: none

Mark Potter made a motion to accept the agenda, with a second by Lisa Gibbs. Motion passed.

Neil Hjelmeland made a motion to accept the financial report and to pay all bills, with a second from Lisa Gibbs. Motion passed.

Mark Potter made a motion to accept the September 8, 2020 minutes, with a second from Lisa Gibbs. Motion passed.

OLD BUSINESS

E. 9th Street Sewer Extension: Curt Marx was in attendance to discuss the project, which began Monday. Mr. Marx discussed with Neil Hjelmeland about moving his service lateral. Dave Johannes' service lateral has been moved as well. Elcor has dug about 120-feet up from 8th Street and have set up the first manhole. Elcor does have to retain access to driveways by the end of the day for homeowners to get home. Project should be set to be finished and tested by the end of next week, so homeowners can get their plumbers in for connection in 2 weeks. By the end of the project they will only lay patching blacktop, with mill and overlay next Spring. Mr. Marx brought a proposal for milling the street and overlaying it just past the project for about \$20,000. If accepted this would need to be a change order. Chad Larson requested a full street mill and overlay and a second quote for 8th Street.

Old Town Hall renovations: Mayor Johannes only has one proposal from Kendall Lumber and Marvin Kreidermacher. There would be a uni-sex bathroom, new cabinets, and the middle wall would be shortened, the quote also includes taking out the old sheetrock, drywall, taping and painting for a total amount of \$39,824. This does not include electrical or plumbing costs. Mr. Johannes is waiting on 2 more quotes.

CARES funding: All applications from small businesses have been received. Mark Potter made a motion to grant \$2,500 to TDI, TMD, K & C Pumphouse, Tiger Lily Tattoo and Studio Fourteen, and \$1,000 grant to Stockton First Responders. Motion seconded by Lisa Gibbs. Motion passed.

AFLAC insurance: Work comp will pay up to 66% of gross wages and is tax free. Council has decided not to pursue at this time.

NEW BUSINESS

Snowplow Contract: Potter Construction quoted \$150 per hour for plowing, sanding and winter grader. Dave Johannes made a motion to accept the quote, with Lisa Gibbs seconding the motion. Motion passed with Mark Potter abstaining from the vote.

Splash Pad: Mayor Johannes would like to allocate money for a splash pad at Hinton Park. The one quote he does have is with full installation, about 600-square feet with a recirculation system, for a cost of \$100,000. Lisa Gibbs says she wants the plan to be able to research the system before designating money.

CITY MAINTENANCE

- Duckweed harvesting is okay
- Sander for the dump truck is about \$3900-4400, needs to get a stainless steel.
- Ballfield embankment fix is finished.
- Dave Johannes asked about the trimming of the trees in front of the North Broadway bridge.
- Mayor Johannes requested to have Chad put up the walls of the ice rink.

Mark Potter made a motion to close the Stockton City Council meeting, with a second from Lisa Gibbs. Motion passed unanimously; meeting adjourned at 7:00 PM.
