

ORDINANCE NO. 114

City of Stockton Electrical Code Ordinance

This Municipality does ordain as follows:

01. Electrical. Subdivision 1. Electrical Code. Whenever the term "electrical code" is used in this chapter it shall mean the electrical code adopted by the State of Minnesota Building Code, Chapter 1315.

Subd 2. Licenses Required. No individual, partnership, corporation, or other business association required by state law to be licensed by the state board of electricity shall do any electrical work within the city unless there is a file in the office of City of Stockton, a copy of the current license issued by the state board of electricity or such other evidence of such license as may be provided by the state board of electricity.

Subd 3. Electricians: Violations. A licensed electrician shall not perform work out of the class for which a license is held.

02. Permits Required. Except as provided hereafter, no installation, alteration or addition of electrical work for light, heat or power within the limits of the city shall be commenced, continued, or completed unless a permit therefore has first been obtained from the electrical inspector. Except as provided below, any wire or apparatus installed in such a manner that the same could be used for electric, light, heat or power purposes, shall be deemed an installation, alteration or addition within the meaning of this section and a permit shall be required and inspection made as provided.

Public service corporations engaged in the distribution of electricity for light, heat or power purposes shall not be required to secure permits for electrical work done in connection with their generating and distribution systems but shall be required to secure permits for all other purposes coming within the scope of this chapter.

.03. Temporary connection Permits. With respect to transient projects requiring temporary electric service and with respect to projects in the process of construction, no connection shall be made or permitted by the energy supplier until receipt of a temporary connection permit issued by the electrical inspector, which permit shall be effective only for the period specified thereon or until a certificate or notice of completion has been issued by the electrical inspector, whichever event sooner occurs.

.04. Permits: Application. All applications for an electrical permit except applications by owners with respect to homesteads containing not more than two dwelling units must be made by and bear the signature of a master electrician duly licensed by the state board of electricity and must be accompanied by plans and specifications sufficient to establish that the proposed electrical work meets the requirements of the electrical code. In addition all applications for electrical permits must state the location of the proposed work, the actual or estimated cost of the work, and such additional information as the electrical

inspector may require.

Effective Date. This Ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after its pass-
and publication.
